9 :30	Guided tour of the permanent exhibition (Re) discover the artefacts and Holocaust survivor testimonies that are at the heart of our exhibition. We will illustrate how to use them in an academic context, in keeping with the learning objectives defined by the Government.

11:15	How can we teach about the Holocaust and human rights? During this presentation we will provide guidance on how to teach these difficult subjects in an effective way. We will also present several educational resources you can easily incorporate into your classes.

1pm	Being a refugee in Canada – This activity about forced migration during the Second World War and today, offers the opportunity to consider why an individual might leave everything behind to start a new life elsewhere, as well as the responsibilities of the state and civil societies. It highlights primary and secondary sources, as well as several analytical charts.
2pm	Break
2 :30	Genocide and intervention This workshop offers the opportunity to study the concept of genocide, its different stages, as well as means of resistance and actions that can be taken, through four case examples.
3 :30-5pm	Conversation and networking We will end the day with a public conversation between a Holocaust survivor and a recently arrived refugee in Canada, followed by an informal networking cocktail.
