THE ORGANIZATION

The mission of the Montreal Holocaust Museum is to inform and educate people of all ages and backgrounds about the Holocaust, while sensitising the public to the universal perils of antisemitism, racism, hate and indifference. Through its permanent exhibition, and a multitude of educational, cultural and commemorative initiatives, the Museum promotes our collective responsibility to respect diversity and the sanctity of all human life. The MHM, a non-profit organization and a recognised charity, is a unique institution in terms of its mandate and reach in Canada.

In recent years, the growing number of visitors and their interest in the MHM has led to the birth of a project to expand the Museum in order to increase the permanent exhibition area, accommodate temporary exhibitions and create a research and documentation centre. The feasibility of relocating the museum in a downtown location was also studied in order to integrate it into the museum circuit. The aim is to educate more and more visitors on the history of the Holocaust and its links with contemporary human rights issues.

In addition, you sporadically support the Museum as part of regular fundraising campaigns and supervise the organization and execution of donor recognition events.
